



# Kid Sight Vision Screenings

Vision disorders are the number one cause of learning problems in young children, and annual screenings are recommended for all kids to see that their vision is developing correctly. The Wimberley Lions Club is offering Kid Sight Vision Screening to children from six months to five years old, but older children can also be screened. Welch Allyn's SPOT screening is quick and does not require a response from the child.

Vision disorders detected by SPOT at this early age alert the parent to the need for a complete eye exam by an eye care professional. The Kid Sight Vision Screening is **provided free of charge** to the community by the Lions club.

Vision disorders detected include:



- Near-sightedness (myopia)
- Far-sightedness (hyperopia)
- Unequal refractive power (anisometropia)
- Blurred vision, eye structure problem (astigmatism)
- Pupil size deviations (anisocoria)
- Eye misalignment (strabismus)



Certain combinations of these disorders are precursors for Lazy Eye, a condition that usually develops before the age of six and must be addressed as early as possible to maximize the chances of a successful correction.
